

Curbside Food Composting

COMPOST PAIL AND CART CARE TIPS



- Add soiled or shredded paper to your pail or cart and wrap messy food scraps in newspaper or butcher paper to help absorb moisture and reduce odors.

- Purchase 2 or 3 gallon size compostable bags to line the container. No odors, no mess—and cleanup is quick and easy!
- You can also repurpose a trash can into a compost can—various sizes of compostable bags are available at local stores (see reverse) or online.



- If you are not using a compostable bag, remember to wash the pail regularly with soap and water. Sprinkle baking soda or rub vinegar on the inside of your compost pail or cart lid to avoid odors and fruit flies.

- Get a smaller compost cart from NRWS if you don't have many yard trimmings each week, but want to be part of the food composting program.
